Remembering John C. Tyson (1951-1995)

John C. Tyson, state librarian of Virginia from 1990-1994, died in November after a brief illness. He was 44. At the time of his death, Tyson was an associate professor at the Graduate School of Information Sciences at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville. He also was president of John Tyson and Associates, a library management consulting firm specializing in human resource development. Before his appointment as Virginia's state librarian, Tyson served as university librarian at the University of Richmond (1986-1990), and associate professor and assistant director for planning, administration,

and development at Northern Illinois University (1984-1986). A passionate supporter of the library profession, Tyson was a force behind the creation of the Black Caucus of ALA (BCALA). In 1992 he received the Distinguished Service Award from the BCALA for "his leadership and vision in planning the First National Conference of African American Librarians."
