FROM THE EDITORS

The early response to the Informal Logic Newsletter has been encouraging. Most of the inquiries have been from philosophers but we have also had inquiries from psychologists, mathematicians, and political scientists.

This is our way of saying that we need many more subscribers if we are going to keep this publication afloat.
