# A SUPPLEMENTARY CHECK-LIST OF DECAPO-DA, FRESH-WATER FISH, AMPHIBIA, REPTILES AND SMALL MAMMALS RECORDED IN THE KRUGER NATIONAL ARK

Supplementary to the list of animals provided in "The Annual Report of the Biologist", ("Koedoe" No. 3, 1960, p. 1) the following is a list of new material collected and identified during the year 1959/1960.

 Present in all the river systems of the Park but not yet recorded for the Levubu river.

2. Barbus kerstenii\* Peters — Kersten's ghilliemientjie. From the upper reaches of the Sabie near Phaben.

- Barbus rapax Steindachner Silverfish or Paper-mouth.
   Recorded from the Nkayeni waterhole in the Shingwedzi river and Ngwendu pool in the Mapongole river.
- 4. Barbus rubellus Crass Red-eye ghilliemientjie. So far only taken at Mapale waterhole in the Shingwedzi.
- 5. Barbus umbeluziensis\* Groenewald Umbeluzi ghilliemientjie. Present in all the river systems of the Park.
- Labeo darlingi\* Boulenger Darling's Mudfish.
   Taken from waterholes in the Mbyamide, Nwashitsaka, Manzentonto, Nwatimhiri, Bubube, Shingwedzi, Mapongole. Mtjulu, Mlambane and Olifants rivers.

 Chiloglanis engiops Crass — Spotted sucker-mouth catfish. Has a similar distribution pattern to the above species.

Gerrhosaurus nigrolineatus (Hallowell) — Black-lined plated lizard.
 A single specimen was collected at Skukuza.

1. Cordylus laevigatus (FitzSimons) — Zoutpansberg girdled lizard. Ridge behind Punda Milia camp; Shipudze; Matukwane; Dongadziba.

1. Nucras intertexta intertexta (A. Smith) — Smith's spotted sandveld

So far only found near Crocodile Bridge.

 Monopeltis capensis capensis A. Smith — Southern Worm-lizard. Between Olifants river causeway and Mangwa-induna; east of Machai pan; Nwambia firebreak roads; near Tambye crossing on the main road to Pafuri; Madziringwe.

- Boaedon fuliginosus fuliginosus (Boie) Common house snake. Shingwedzi; Satara; Levubu riverbank at Pafuri; new Olifants camp; Matukwane drift; Skukuza; Pretoriuskop.
- 2. Philothamnus hoplogaster (Günther) Green water snake. Nahpe dam; Tshokwane waterhole; Gondweni waterhole; Pukwane.
- 3. Philothamnus irregularis irregularis (Leach) Eastern green water snake.
  - A single specimen was obtained at Bangu poort.
- 4. Philothamnus natalensis (A. Smith) Natal green water snake. Nwanetzi west windmill.
- 5. Prosymna ambigua stuhlmanni (Pfeffer) Spotted shovel-nosed snake. 1 Mile east of Mtsawu drift (Hippopool road); Skukuza; Tshokwane.

6. Prosymna sundevallii sundevallii (A. Smith) — Sundevall's shovel-nosed snake.

Mahlangene.

7. Mehelya capensis capensis (A. Smith) — File snake. Numbi gate.

### SUB-FAMILY: DASYPELTINAE

SUB-FAMILY: BOIGINAE (Back-fanged snakes).

- Chamaetortus aulicus aulicus Günther Günther's banded snake.
   A single specimen of this rare snake was collected at night in Satara restcamp.
- Hemirhagerrhis nototaenia nototaenia (Günther) Günther's spotted or bark snake. Pafuri; Skukuza.
- Rhamphiophis oxyrhynchus rostratus Peters Eastern hook-nosed snake. Hlahleni drift on the way to Gorge camp; Pafuri; Madziringwe firebreak; 4 miles north of the Sandriver causeway.
- Psammophis angolensis (Bocage) Angola or black-headed sand snake.
   Ridge behind Punda Milia camp (under loose boulder).
- Amblyodipsas microphthalma (Bianconi) White-lipped snake.
   A very rare species of which a specimen was collected at Matukwane, Punda Milia area.
- Aparallactus guentheri (Boulenger) Günther's centipede-eater.
   According to old records of the Transvaal Museum a few specimens were collected many years ago at Punda Milia and Malelane.
- Aparallactus Iunulatus Iunulatus (Peters) Banded centipede-eater. Pafuri; Tambye drift near Pafuri; Ngirivane.
   No new records.

### FAMILY: MACROSCELIDIDAE

 Petrodromus tetradactylus Peters — Forest elephant shrew.
 A young animal was collected in the Msimbit forest near Shashanga dam and two adults at the foot of the ridge behind Punda Milia restcamp.

### SUPER-FAMILY: SORICOIDEA

#### FAMILY: SORICIDAE

- Crocidura bicolor (Bocage) Dwarf musk shrew.
   A single specimen was collected at Skukuza and skull fragments of this species were found in owl pellets from Hape hut, Pafuri; a hollow baobab tree along the Machindudzi firebreak road; Matupa cave; Mbangari; Timbavati; Skukuza koppies; near Malahla-panga; Shilowa cave.
- Crocidura cyanea infumata (Wagner) Reddish-grey musk shrew.
   One specimen was obtained from Malelane and skull fragments in owl pellets collected at the hollow baobab tree, Machindudzi firebreak.
- 3. Crocidura hirta Peters Reddish-brown musk shrew. Skull fragments of these shrews were found in abundance in owl pellets obtained from Hape hut, Pafuri; a hollow baobab tree along the Machindudzi firebreak; Matupa cave; Mbangari; Timbavati; near Malahla-panga; Skukuza koppies and Shilowa cave.

ORDER 2: CHIROPTERA

SUB-ORDER 1: MEGACHIROPTERA

FAMILY: PTEROPODIDAE

SUB-FAMILY: PTEROPODINAE

Epomophorus crypturus Peters — Lesser epauletted fruit bat.
 On examination of the material collected in the Park it became apparent that all specimens except one were of this species and not Epomophorus wahlbergi wahlbergi as was at first presumed.

### SUB-ORDER 2: MICROCHIROPTERA

### FAMILY: EMBALLONURIDAE

 Taphozous mauritianus Geoffroy — Tomb bat. Collected at Malelane and Hartbeesfontein camp.

FAMILY: NYCTERIDAE

No new species collected.

FAMILY: RHINOLOPHIDAE

### SUB-FAMILY: RHINOLOPHINAE

- Rhinolophus darlingi K. Anderson Darling's leafnosed bat. Skukuza koppies; Shipikane koppies; Mahlangene; Matupa cave and Makahanja.
- Rhinolophus landeri lobatus Peters Lesser leafnosed bat. A single specimen was collected at the Ngirivane cave.

### SUB-FAMILY: HIPPOSIDERINAE

Hipposideros caffer caffer Sundevall — Cape leafnosed bat.
 Tshokwane; Munweni cave; Bangu poort cave; Shaben kop cave; Shingwedzi camp.

### FAMILY: MOLOSSIDAE

1. Tadarida (Chaerephon) limbata Peters — White-winged free-tailed bat.

Numerous specimens were collected at Punda Milia.

2. Tadarida (Mops) condylura A. Smith — Angola free-tailed bat. Skukuza; Letaba and Shilowa cave.

### FAMILY: VESPERTILIONIDAE

# SUB-FAMILY: VESPERTILIONINAE

- Myotis (Selysius) tricolor Temminck Cape hairy bat.
   A single specimen was collected at Satara.
- Nycticeius (Scoteinus) schlieffeni australis Thomas & Wroughton Schlieffen's dwarf house bat. These tiny bats were collected at Nwambu windmill; Mahlangene; Matiwotsuka; Mbyashishe; Punda Milia; Mbadze picket; Nkuane and Mlondozi picket.
- Scotophilus nigrita dingani A. Smith Yellow house bat.
   Semane windmill; Satara restcamp; Mavumbye and Pretoriuskop.

SUB-FAMILY: MINIOPTERINAE

No new records.

SUB-FAMILY : KERIVOULINAE
No new records.

ORDER 5: LAGOMORPHA

FAMILY: LEPORIDAE

SUB-FAMILY: LEPORINAE

1. Lepus capensis aquilo Thomas and Wroughton — Mozambique hare. The specimen collected at Shingomene on the eastern boundary represents the first of its kind ever recorded for the Union of South Africa.

# ORDER 6: RODENTIA FAMILY: BATHYERGIDAE

 Cryptomus hottentotus Roberts — Hottentot mole-rat. One specimen was collected near Nwanetzi west windmill. Other specimens collected at Letaba restcamp, Mashagadzi, Mahewane, Mahungumula and Shingwedzi have not been properly classified and may be of Cryptomys holosericeus (Wagner).

FAMILY: MURIDAE SUB-FAMILY: MURINAE

- Grammomys dolichurus Smuts Forest mouse. So far only collected in the riverine forest at Pafuri.
- Acomys cahirinus transvaalensis Roberts Transvaal spiny mouse. A single specimen was collected at Punda Milia.

# SUB-FAMILY: DENDROMURINAE

 Dendromus mystacalis įjamesoni Wroughton — Lesser climbing mouse. Collected between Babalala and Stangene on the main road to Punda Milia.

# SUB-FAMILY: OTOMYINAE

 Otomys tugelensis Roberts — Vlei Otomys. A specimen was collected at Stangene viei on the main road to Punda Milia and skull fragments of this rodent were found in owl pellets from Matupa cave and Skukuza koppies.

# SUB-FAMILY: GERBILLINAE

No new records, but the gerbil described as Tatera schinzi limpopoensis (Roberts) in Koedoe No. 3, is now known as Tatera leucogaster salsa Wroughton.
