in Johannesburg with 240 participants. Competition is separate for four groups: spinal cord injuries (including poliomyelitis), amputees, cerebral palsied and blind. The National Games will be held in Stellenbosch in April 1983 and it is hoped to bring overseas teams to compete at these. The Classification Committee needs more members especially in the Transvaal.

World Confederation for Physical Therapy.

The agenda for the Council meeting was not completed. It dealt with such matters as amendments to ethical rules and articles of association; applications for membership; increased membership fees and electing new office bearers and members of the Executive Committee. (See detailed report in September issue).

OTHER BUSINESS:

A new Professional Board is due to be elected in early 1983, but the date has not been set. It is hoped to publish names of candidates and their manifesto's in the March issue, but it may be too late.

The date of the next N.C.R. meeting will be set at Council, to be held in Bloemfontein in July 1983.

The Introduction explains how to use the booklet and why it is necessary. The information is set out under the following headings: The Planning Stage: Features to be considered in preparing a building submission; Specifications for design special features, dimensions, area determination; Design features; Special features to be considered in a paediatric area. Useful information on such details as planning committees, estimating patient population and staffing requirements, facilities and equipment required, educationrelated facilities, emergency resuscitation equipment, specifications of different areas/equipment/facilities, features of design related to areas, access, ventilation, communication, electrical system and standards/regulations etc., is given.
